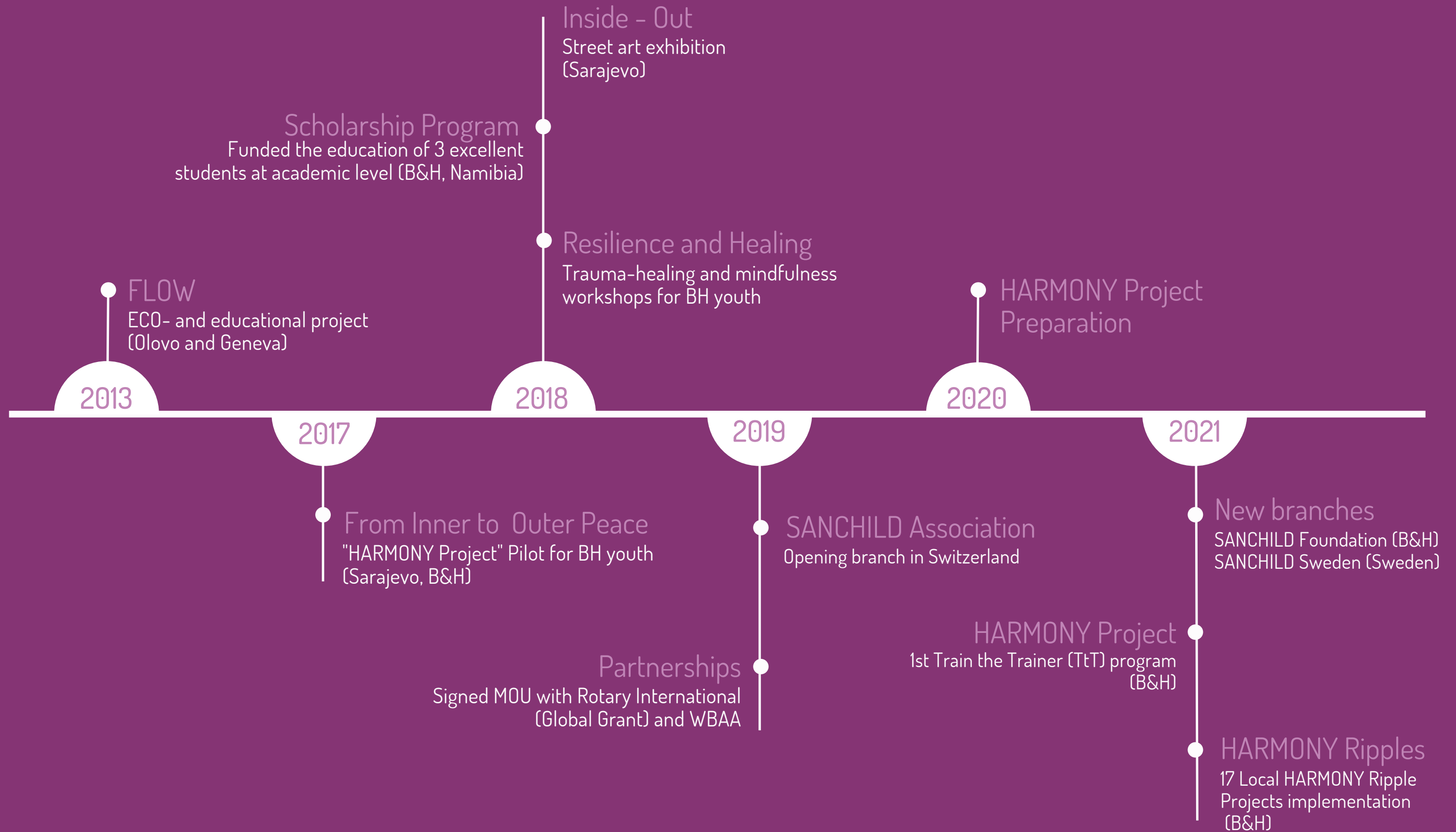


About Us

IS A NON-PROFIT, NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION,
DEDICATED TO DEVELOPING A CULTURE OF SUSTAINABLE PEACE
AND HARMONIOUS LIVING THROUGH HUMAN-CENTERED PROGRAMS.

Our goal is to provide communities with transformational tools in an environment that promotes sustainable peace and inclusion. This is achieved through our human-centric programs and our four focus pillars:

- education
- well-being
- personal and socio-economic development
- environmental sustainability

Our projects are carefully created to support personal development and positive transformation of local communities, by drawing peace from the inside-out.

Since 2013, we have been working on building a culture of sustainable peace, by providing support, education and various activities to support overcoming cultural, religious and ethnic differences in the Western Balkan region, protect environment and support socio-economic development.





Our work

Historically, people in the Western Balkans lived together peacefully, despite cultural, ethnic, and religious diversity. However, during the prolonged civil war of the 1990s, they experienced continuous violence and the traumatic experience of ethnic cleansing, rape, and torture. Therefore, we currently mainly operate in the Balkan region, where many young people live with the self-perpetuating cycle of post-war terror, enduring trans-generational trauma and fear of differences. However, we plan to grow and expand to other regions on local, national and international levels.

"I am a historian by training but have never subscribed to the notion that history repeats itself. Rather, it's constantly repeated human behaviours that create tragedies across the historical timeline. Perhaps SANCHILD's HARMONY Project in B&H can break the destructive cycle of human behaviours by encouraging people to understand their differences and find unity in guiding positive change across fractured communities. SANCHILD offers a realistic vision that might ensure another Srebrenica never happens."

This is an inclusive platform that continuously provides opportunities and support to the local teachers, artists, social workers, and activists who seek positive changes in themselves and their communities.

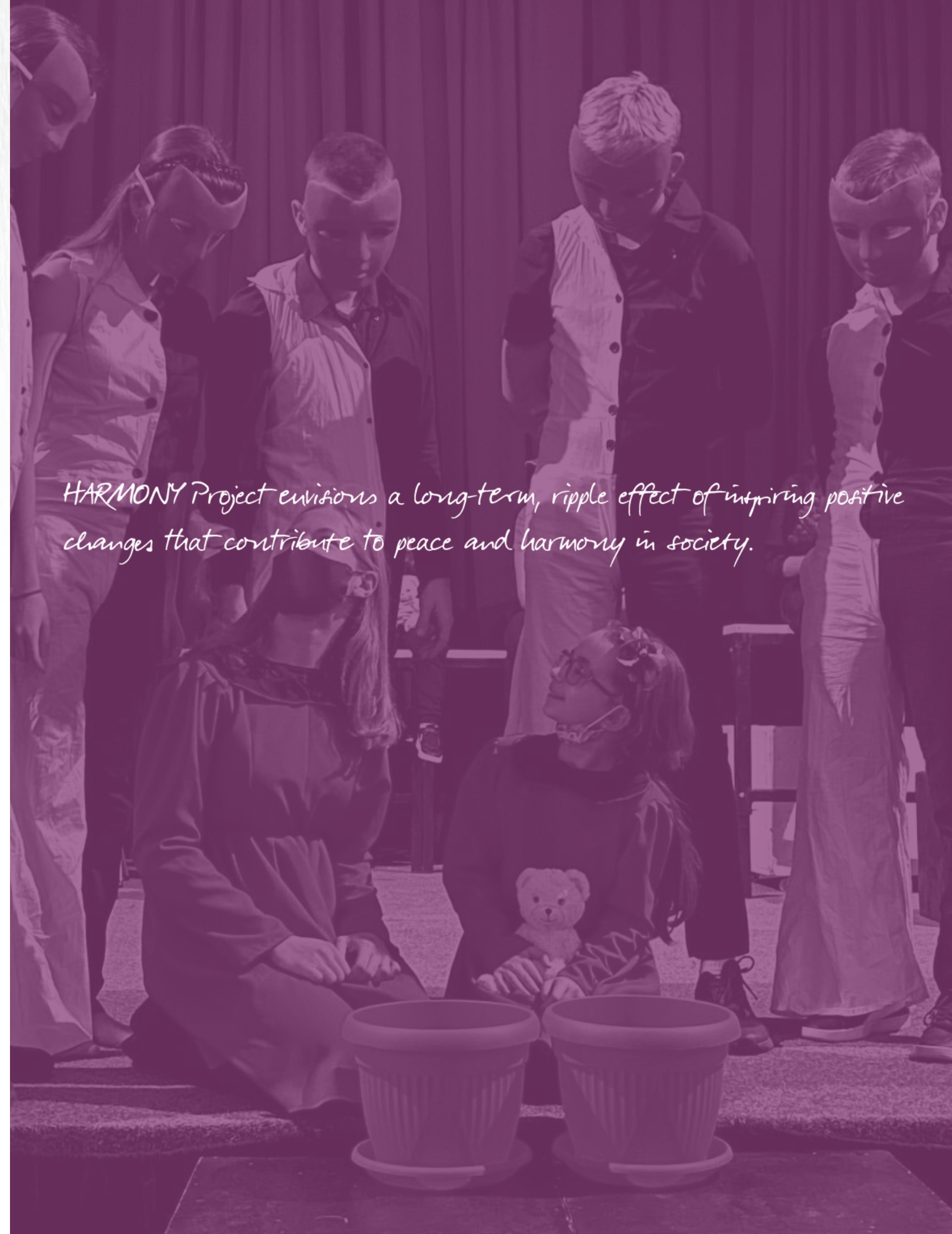
HARMONY Program

HARMONY Program is a series of projects and activities that ensure a long-lasting and measurable effects of our work.

The first phase - "Train the Trainer" program - is created to increase personal and professional capacities of local professionals, and contribute to the sustainable well-being, inner-peace and interpersonal skills. Upon completion of the program, trainees become "HARMONY Trainers", implementing their "Ripple projects". Using our human-centric approach and their professional skills, trainees address the most pressing issues in local communities, therefore creating a lasting ripple effect of positive changes.



HARMONY Project envisions a long-term, ripple effect of inspiring positive changes that contribute to peace and harmony in society.



Our first "Train the Trainer" program was implemented from June 27th to July 3rd, 2021, in Tarčin, Bosnia and Herzegovina. It resulted in 17 Ripple projects, implemented between September and December 2021, at 12 locations across the country.

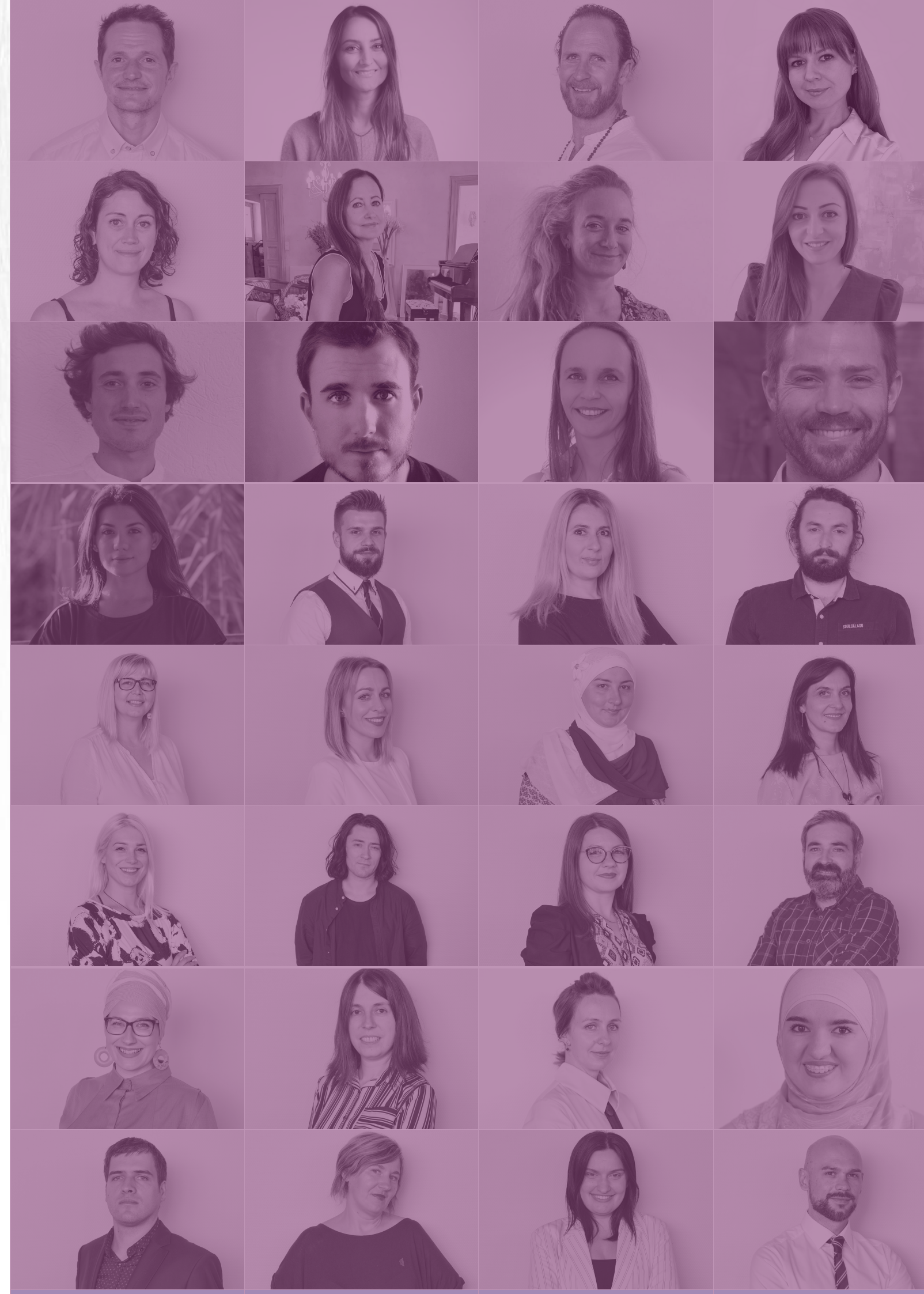


HARMONY Network

HARMONY Network ensures the implementation of the long-term HARMONY vision, by connecting professionals, organizations and companies, to continuously provide opportunities and support to its members.

Our first Network members are 13 professional coaches and facilitators of the HARMONY Train the Trainer program, and 19 trainees who will continue their work in the following years,

Overcoming cultural differences

One of the most pressing issues in B&H are ongoing political tensions which are resulting in misinformation, prejudices and further separation among people.

To address this topic,
we have implemented 4 projects
with 98 young beneficiaries.

Through Life-Long Dialogue to Eternal Harmony

34 local high school students of different ethnic and cultural backgrounds spent 2 days together on a workshop about connection with themselves (mindfulness practices), their environment, overcoming school-caused stress and having healthy dialogues with the focus on building harmonious and lasting relationships.

The project was implemented on September 17-18th 2021.

Location: Konjic, B&H

Direct beneficiaries: 34 young people (17-19 y/o)



LEARNING AND REWARDING Through Treasure Hunting

This was a 3-day camp in an isolated location, which brought together sixth-graders with excellent grades in school. They were divided into 4 groups, to compete in knowledge and for the well-being of others. The modules were based on the application of traditionally acquired knowledge and skills, without using the technology.

The students of the winning group were awarded a hidden treasure (4 laptops) which they further awarded to 2 excellent students from their schools and 2 NGOs with a strong impact in local communities.

Location: Vlasic Mountain, B&H

Beneficiaries: 18 students (12 y/o)



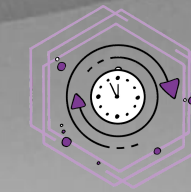
Youth Power for Better Future in B&H

This is a 3-days training, where 20 young people and education sector representatives had a number of workshops about the benefits of exchange programs, non-formal education, opportunities in partner organizations that host young people from B&H and finally, benefit from the experiences of previous volunteers.

In the workshops they learned about identities, cultures, long and short-term youth-exchange opportunities, and performed peer-to-peer sharing of experiences and skills in writing application documents for the programs.

Location: Brcko, B&H

Beneficiaries: 20 (18-40 y/o)



IMAGINE AND THINK – Put Yourself in Another Man's Skin

This project challenged the narratives about different historical events that affected B&H and the Balkan region. To break prejudices and boundaries among youth, participants discussed democracy, cultural and gender issues, inter-generational differences, the importance of the critical thinking, and many other topics, to prevent the history repeating itself. The long-term objective of the project is to facilitate a new kind of history teaching in B&H, by supporting young people to address “peace education” and promote it through digital platforms.

Location: Novi Travnik and Travnik, B&H

Beneficiaries: 26 (14-18 y/o)

Women and Girls Empowerment

Although women in B&H have equal rights as men in terms of education, participation in society, politics and economy – they often need support and encouragement to feel strong, stand up against injustices and express themselves. Women and girls empowerment aims to support women, build their confidence, mental and emotional resilience, give them visibility and promote their work, and prevent violence of different kinds.

To address this topic,
we have implemented 5 projects
with 108 direct beneficiaries.

Talking About Us

In collaboration with "Mothers and Daughters" project, to raise awareness and understanding of human rights, 2 round tables were organized to discuss sexual exploitation, human trafficking, violence, the "Istanbul Convention", and many other related social issues. The discussion was constructed around the on the current situation and examples from Bosnia and Herzegovina, and focused on creating and supporting the action plan for improvements, education, and victims' support.

Location: Mostar, B&H

Beneficiaries: 24 (representatives from governmental and non-governmental organizations)

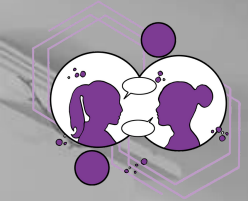


Mothers and Daughters

In collaboration with "Talking about us" project, three days workshops were organized to promote healthy communication and strengthen the relationship between mothers and daughters to: break gender stereotypes, end cycles of violence, empower women to express themselves and speak-up without fear. With the provided techniques, they were able to learn how to create the necessary conditions for a safe, healing, empowering, and cohesive circle of women, that will not only provide the emotional support, but also promote strong women leadership.

Location: Mostar, B&H

Direct Beneficiaries: 14 girls and women (15-60 y/o)



Women In Small Businesses

The goal of "WISB" was to publish articles about successful and brave women who started and now lead their own businesses. The aim was to encourage and inspire all women to take the first step in creating their own ideas and brands. During the 4 months period, Balkan Diskurs published 6 positive stories in 2 languages, that provided those women visibility and recognition and others with the information and guidance about the available support.

Location: Online

Direct beneficiaries: 6 women

Indirect beneficiaries: 46k+ (audience)



Serendipity

Bihac is a small city located at the B&H border with Croatia, and has 2 large refugee camps, where the immigrant crisis is taking a toll.

The project aimed to empower local and refugee teenage girls from a local shelter, to overcome anxiety, fear and learn how to handle life challenges in difficult life conditions. Working with professionals, they received training in self-love, empowerment, accepting their identities, etc. This project will result in written journals on their development over-time, which will be accessible in schools and on SANCHILD NGO website.

Location: Bihac, B&H

Direct beneficiaries: 18 teenage girls (8-18 y/o)

Women Inspired by Space

This project is created to empower non-established female artists through art and mindfulness training.

During the 3 days educational workshops, 30 women had opportunity to attend lectures and participate in various activities about women empowerment, relationship between mindfulness and creativity and different art therapies. Participant's artwork (photography, painting, written words) is collected and published in the book called "Žene nadahunte sve(mirom)".

The book contains 16 poems, 14 stories and essays, 44 fine and digital art, and 4 crafts.

Location: Sarajevo, B&H

Direct beneficiaries: 30 female artists (25+ y/o)

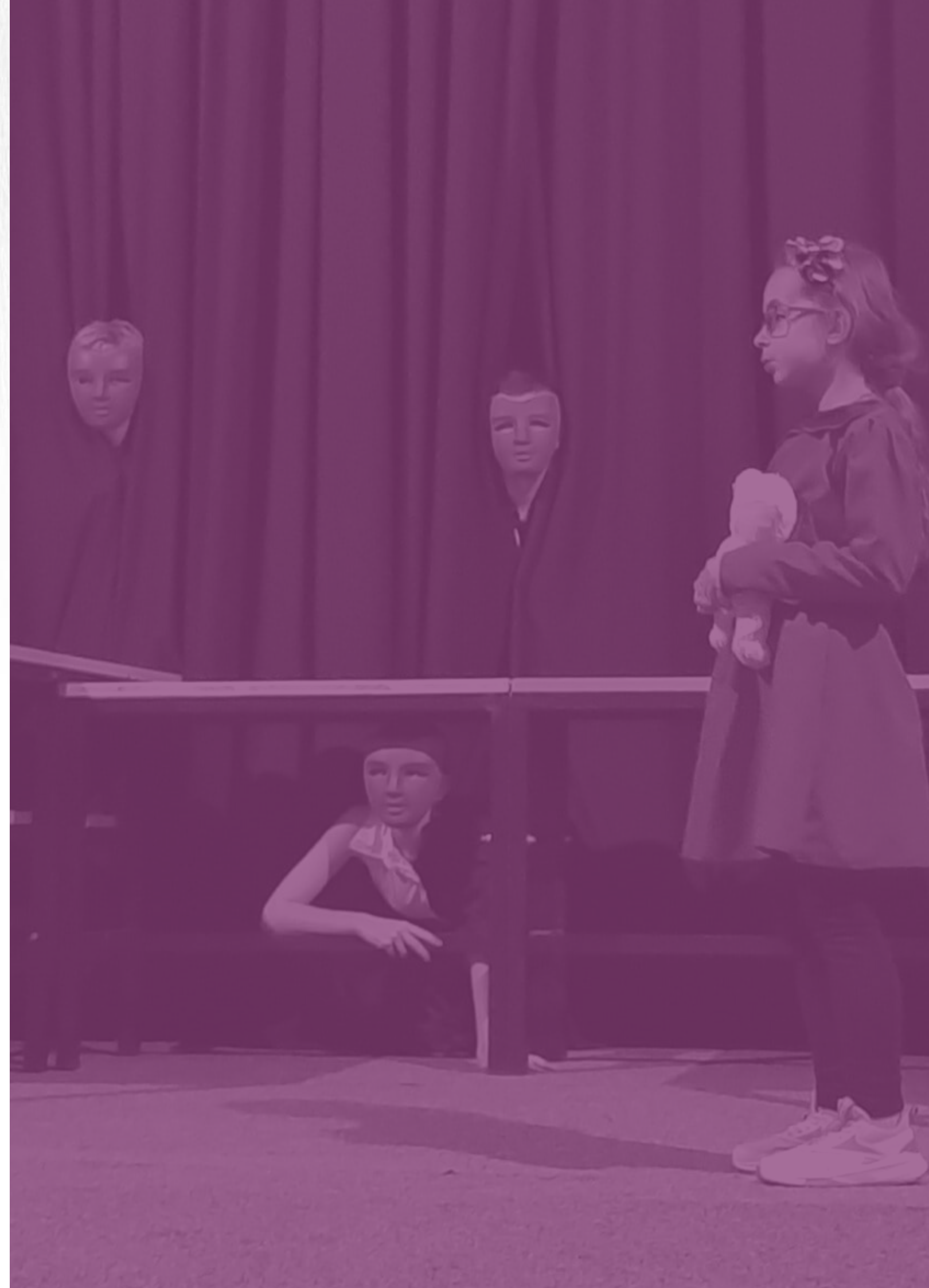

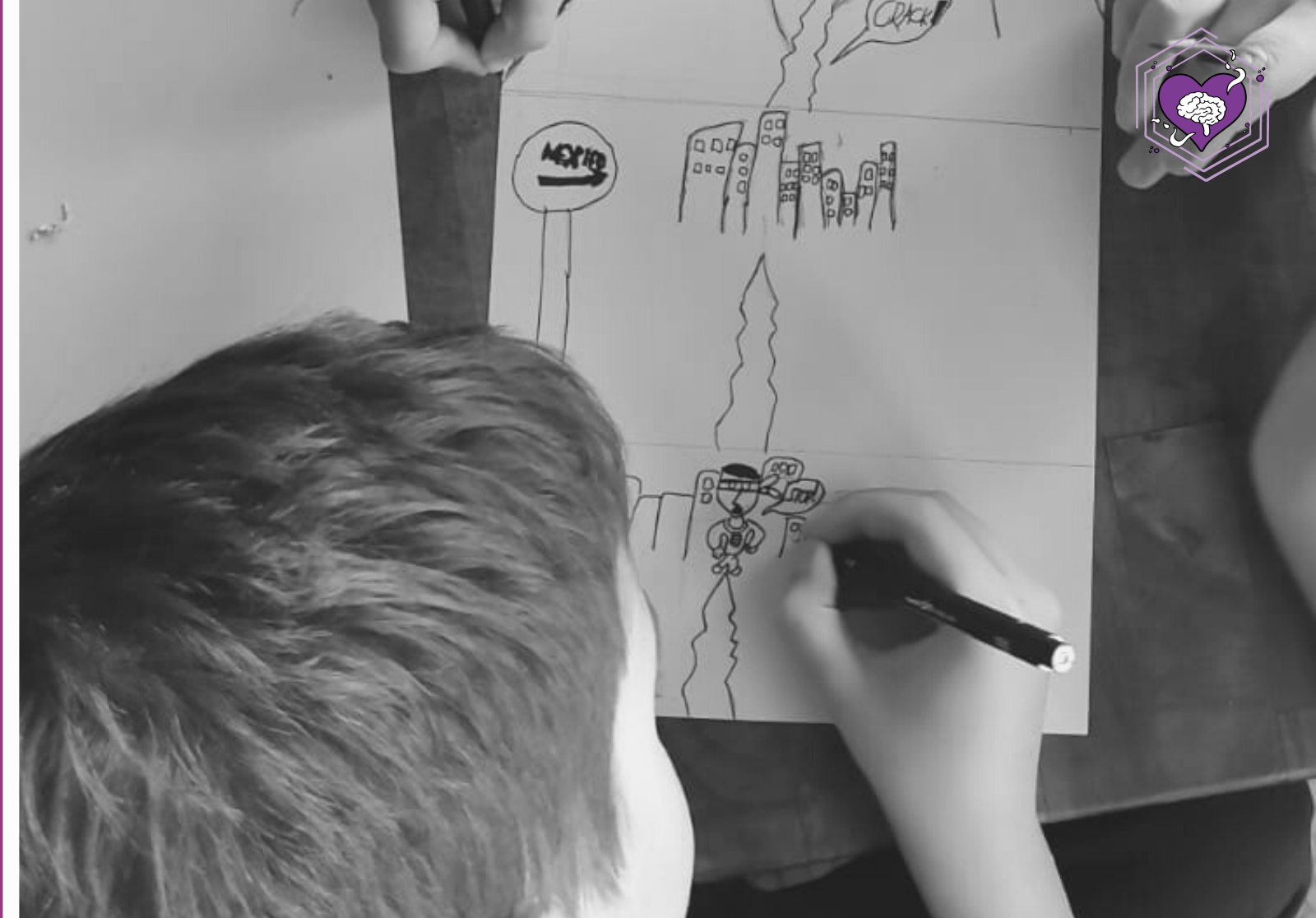
Find Your Inspiration

The vision of the project is to initiate positive changes in the lives of those who sometimes feel unmotivated or need a support to express their authentic inner beings through different creative forms. Creative content and inspiring stories will be posted daily on Facebook page "Find your inspiration".

To kick-off the project, art workshop was organized on 11/09/2021, where participants expressed their emotions through painting, and during the evening they enjoyed music therapy session at Dzipsi.Dzipsi in Sarajevo, B&H. 19 people participated in this workshop that Marija organized, and the Facebook page will stay active and with her content she is planning to inspire more people for a very long time.

Location: Sarajevo and online

Beneficiaries: 19 (10-55 y/o) + online more than 130 followers



Connecting Through Arts

In collaboration with the "Learning and Rewarding" project, "Connecting through arts" workshop is created to teach children creative comic arts and illustrative storytelling techniques.

By expressing their emotions with drawings, participants were able to connect over the similar ideas, and present them through imaginary or real-life heroes from their local environments. They also co-created art pieces, tackling many local and global issues for which they found solutions together.

Location: Vlasic Mountain, B&H

Beneficiaries: 20 children (y/o)



Theater for Change

This is an artistic-research project that examines a notion of “freedom” through drama play “Behind the walls”. With the application of drama pedagogy methods and elements of applied theater, the project was created to develop empathy, compassion and human rights awareness among the 24 young actors. Through the play that follows the tragic child abduction case, actors sent a message that mindful understanding of one’s needs, setting boundaries of media influence and respecting diversity, are prerequisites for freedom. Premiere was organized on Dec 10th, to celebrate the “International Human Rights Day”.

Location: Tuzla, B&H

Beneficiaries: 24 young actors (13-25 y/o) with the final audience of 150 participants followed with roundtable discussions.

Emotions and Well-being

Understanding your own identities, emotions and building mental resilience is important for building strong and meaningful relationship with others, and to prevent stereotypes and violence.

In a fast-paced world, people often forget to take care of themselves and build self-compassion, which is not a skill taught in schools.

we have implemented 5 projects
with 77 direct beneficiaries.

E-motions

This project is created for marginalized Roma children in Visoko, to contribute to their social inclusion and the development of emotional competencies of this target group. 5 workshops were organized to provide them with the tools and teach them skills for recognizing emotions in themselves and others, processing and finally expressing them in a controlled, mindful and creative manner. Finally, children used different art forms to express their emotions, tell stories and present imagination, while using painting techniques, music instruments and written word.

Location: Visoko, B&H

Beneficiaries: 15 (6-14 y/o)



You are the Power

Over the course of 3 months, 16 students attended workshops on social cohesion, psychological processing of emotions, communication, and art therapy. By working with psychologists and artists, they learned how to better process and express their thoughts and feelings, while discovering a lot more about themselves and others.

They had an opportunity to learn new and improve their skills in active listening, using body language, communication in a conflict, properly setting the boundaries, which in turn helped them to regain confidence, build healthy relationships and become conscious of their power.

Location: Travnik and Sarajevo, B&H

Beneficiaries: 16 students (14-18 y/o)

Be in Harmony My Friend

This project was created to help teenagers to understand, overcome and embrace their negative emotions. Such ability is one of the main pillars of the personal growth. Students from 2 high schools participated in 7 workshops, divided into 2 phases, and the students from the first phase assisted the teacher and the participants from the second, practicing peer-to-peer sharing. These shared experiences taught them to accept their emotions and enabled them to become adults capable of dealing with their thoughts and feelings without being overwhelmed.

Location: Zenica, B&H

Beneficiaries: 29 (15-18 y/o)



The Power of Listening

The project is created for certified yoga instructors who already have their target groups, whom they help to create better connections with themselves and their surroundings. With the provided tools in effective listening, it helps them to facilitate their profession with therapeutic work. Such tools help better understanding of oneself and others, eases the tension, helps speaker to relax and create more fulfilling relationships where curiosity overpowers the prejudices. Such practices can be used in professional work and everyday life.

Location: Sarajevo, B&H

Beneficiaries: 10 (25-45 y/o)

All you need

This project was a one-day webinar held on October 30th, 2021 and was open for everyone interested in meditation and mental health. Four professional trainers provided tools and exercises for mindfulness, self-acceptance, mental and physical well-being, necessary to easily handle everyday stresses. The project put emphasis on positive psychology, breathing exercises and yoga, but also different strategies on how to overcome conflict and emotional distress. The focus was on the beauty of the balance between our bodies and minds.

Location: Online

Beneficiaries: 23 (22-55 y/o)



In partnership with the Rotary Club Geneve International, we have provided 4 laptops and hence supported the education of 2 primary school children and the work of 2 local humanitarian and non-profit organizations.

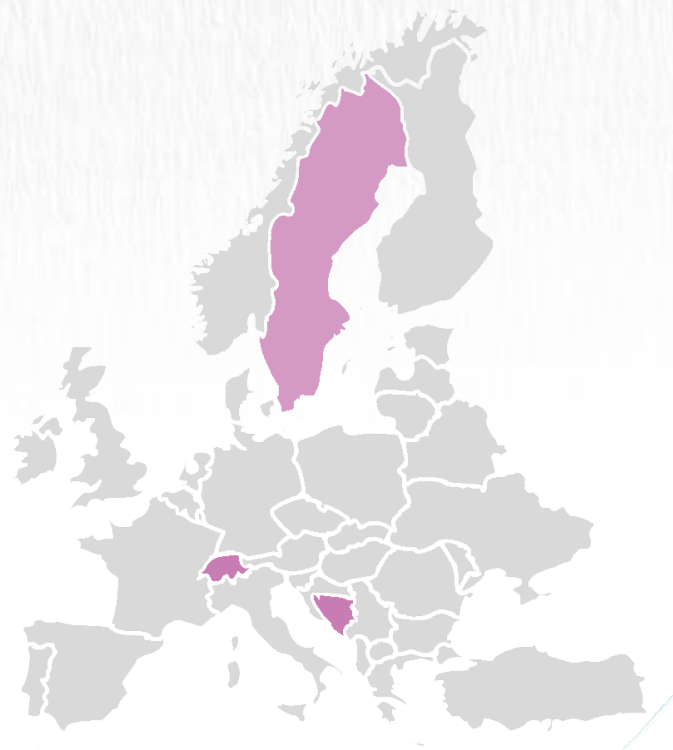

The Foundation obtains funding for its activities through a competitive bidding for donor-supported projects (local and international) available for project activities under contractual terms and conditions and through building mutual relations and cooperation with other non-governmental entities and individuals.

Humanitarian revenues for year 2021 are disclosed in amount of BAM 71.284. In the reporting period, ie the first year of its establishment, the Foundation generated humanitarian income based on the Memorandum of Understanding signed with the Rotary Club Sarajevo and Rotary Club Geneva International, as well as by individual donations from individuals and legal entities.

The Foundation is a not-for-profit organization and as such is exempt from income tax for due to the fact that Foundation receives funds from other legal entities, i.e. different donors who support Foundation's project activities. Pursuant to applicable legislation, as Foundations are relived of filing tax declaration and paying income taxes and are exempted from this duty for the types of incomes defined by law (revenues from the budget and public funds of the state and all other levels of government, sponsorships, donations in money and goods, or transfer of goods.) For the income arising from the performing of any commercial services, non-profit entities become profit tax payers for this segment of operations only.

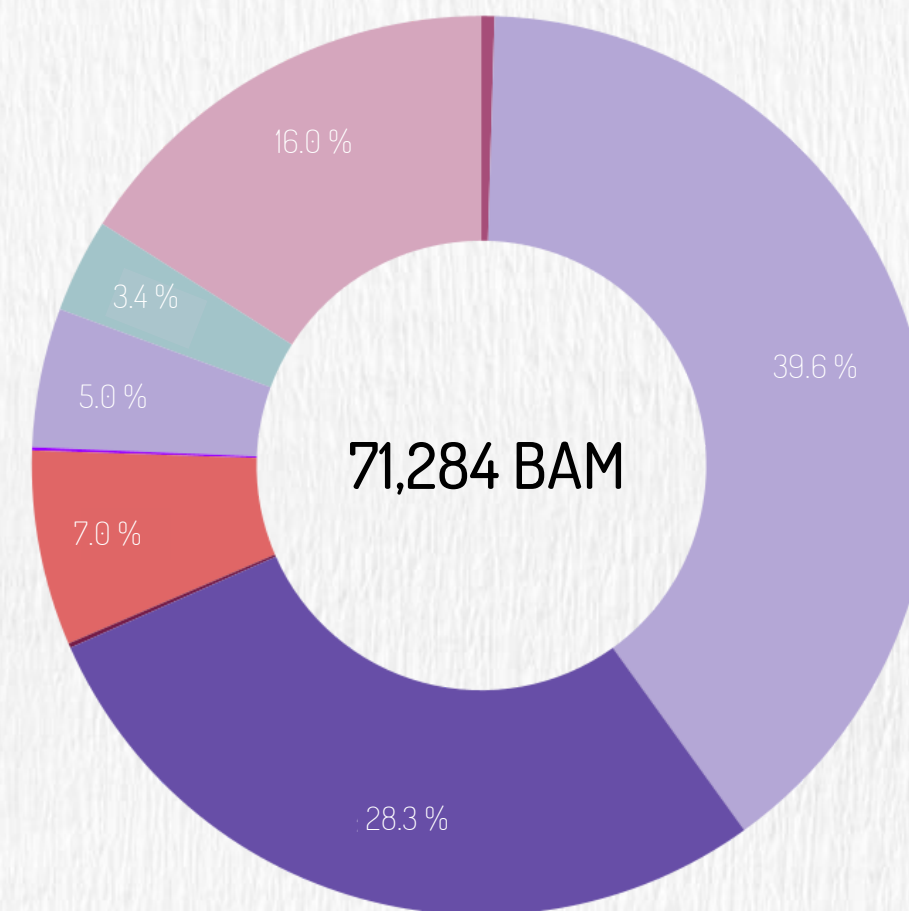
Final Conclusion
